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ACT I

- APPROXIMATELY 45 MINUTES -

During the autumn of 1897, Clara Stahlbaum and her favorite Uncle Drosselmeyer visit the Tennessee Centennial Exposition at the Parthenon. Clara is entranced by the magic of the fair and inspired by the many cultures she encounters there. Drosselmeyer, who is a magician, entertains Clara with tricks. He presents her with a beautiful Nutcracker from a German toymaker, but then makes it disappear! Two months later, several families pass through Shelby Bottoms on their way to a holiday party at the Stahlbaums' home. The area has frozen over and ice skaters move gracefully (and not so gracefully) across the ice. Drosselmeyer appears carrying many gifts for Clara and the other children at the party. His handsome young assistant, who is visiting for the holidays, assists him. At the Stahlbaum home, Clara and her brother, Fritz, eagerly wait outside the parlor door for their first view of the beautifully lit Christmas tree. Just before their governess opens the door to let them in, Fritz surprises Clara with a mouse! Guests arrive at the party, give gifts, and dance to celebrate the holiday season.

When Drosselmeyer and his assistant arrive, Drosselmeyer performs his magic tricks and presents his life-sized dolls for the guests. Drosselmeyer saves the best gift of all for Clara-the Nutcracker doll that she saw at the Centennial Exposition! In a jealous fit, Fritz grabs the Nutcracker and breaks it, but Drosselmeyer uses his magic to repair the Nutcracker. After an evening of holiday festivities, the guests bid farewell and the Stahlbaums go to bed, leaving the Nutcracker by the fireplace. The Stahlbaum parlor is dim and quiet. The peace is suddenly disturbed by several baby mice, followed by medium mice, and large mice. Clara gets out of bed and goes downstairs looking for her new gift. She takes the Nutcracker to the couch and falls asleep. She is startled awake by the Mouse King, who steals the Nutcracker from her. Drosselmeyer appears and Clara tearfully explains to him what happened. Drosselmeyer reassures her and begins to perform his magic. Suddenly the parlor disappears, and the Christmas tree begins to grow. The Nutcracker appears and he, too, has grown!

His army of frontiersmen, cavalry, and toy soldiers fight a fierce battle against the mice while the Nutcracker duels with the Mouse King. Just as it appears the Mouse King will get the better of the Nutcracker, Clara distracts him by hitting him with her shoe. Thanks to her help, the Nutcracker is able to win the battle! Frightened by Drosselmeyer's powers, the mice scurry away and the Nutcracker reappears as a handsome prince. The Nutcracker Prince takes Clara on a wonderful journey. As they travel through a crystal wonderland that looks just like the magical mica stone Clara saw at the exposition, they come upon a Snow Queen and King. Beautiful snowflakes dance in the sparkling palace until the Snow Queen and King send Clara and the Prince onto their next adventure.

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ACT II

- APPROXIMATELY 45 MINUTES -

On their journey, Clara and the Nutcracker Prince stop in the Parthenon Garden, where they encounter the garden fairies and their queen, the Dew Drop Fairy. The Dew Drop Fairy and the Nutcracker Prince, along with the flowers of the forest, dance a beautiful waltz for Clara. After leaving the Parthenon Garden, Clara and the Nutcracker Prince arrive in a land of magic, the Kingdom of the Sugar Plum Fairy. The Sugar Plum Fairy and her Cavalier welcome Clara and introduce visitors from other lands, who look like those Clara saw at the Centennial Exposition. The Spanish, Chinese, Eastern, and Russian visitors each greet Clara with a dance. She also meets a Shepherdess and Shepherd, as well as Madame Bonbonniere and her colorful bon bons. The Sugar Plum Fairy and the Cavalier dance for Clara, who then boards a magical flower carriage for her trip home. Drosselmeyer appears and transforms the Nutcracker Prince back into the Nutcracker doll and places the doll into Clara's arms. As the curtain falls, the magical flower carriage is transformed, and Clara is fast asleep on the couch in her parlor.

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PAUL VASTERLING, Artistic Director

Paul Vasterling's artistic career began at age 10 when he started studying piano, then expanded at age 16 when he started dancing. From this start, Mr. Vasterling landed at Nashville Ballet where he became a company dancer, teacher, rehearsal director, and choreographer. He stepped into the role of Artistic Director of Nashville Ballet in 1998, 10 years after he began his association with the organization.

A choreographer with a deep affinity for music, Mr. Vasterling has created works ranging from classical, full-length story ballets to contemporary one-acts. With a special focus on highlighting the wealth of artistry and rich history of Nashville, Mr. Vasterling's connection to music and passion for community have led to collaborations with numerous nationally and internationally renowned musicians and institutions, including The Bluebird Cafe, Ben Folds, Grammy Award winners Rhiannon Giddens and Francesco Turrisi, and more. Nashville Ballet has commissioned 22 original scores for brand-new ballets under his direction. Mr. Vasterling is also a gifted storyteller with a penchant for creating vivid narratives with stories such as Peter Pan, Layla and the Majnun, Lizzie Borden, Cinderella, Romeo and Juliet, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Seasons, Nashville's Nutcracker, which has been enjoyed by over half a million Middle Tennesseans, Appalachian Spring, and the New York Times and Wall Street Journal acclaimed Lucy Negro Redux.

Beyond his own choreography, Mr. Vasterling has expanded the company's repertoire to include works by Salvatore Aiello, Jennifer Archibald, George Balanchine, James Canfield, Lew Christensen, Jirí Kylián, Matthew Neenan, Twyla Tharp, and Christopher Wheeldon, among many others. He has also edited and updated the classic productions Giselle, The Sleeping Beauty, and Swan Lake, and has grown the company from a troupe of 12 to 32 professional dancers. With a commitment to cultivating an organization high on artistry and dramatic power, Mr. Vasterling has taken Nashville Ballet across the country and beyond—Nashville Ballet's company made its Kennedy Center debut in 2017 and has toured throughout the U.S., including performances in St. Louis, Charleston, Santa Fe, Virginia, Kansas City, Colorado, and a debut at the Chautauqua Institution in August 2018. The company has also toured internationally in South America and Europe, and many of Mr. Vasterling's original works have been staged by companies nationally and internationally. In 2020, he led the company to making their broadcast debut with the televised premiere of Nashville's Nutcracker, for which he won his first Emmy Award, and in 2022, his original ballet, Lucy Negro Redux, embarked on a nationwide tour and made its primetime debut on PBS' multi-award winning Great Performances series. Additionally, he has helped increase Nashville Ballet's operating budget by 800%, prioritized several accessibility and inclusivity initiatives, launched the company's


first-ever free virtual season, and oversaw the purchase and expansion of the company's home base, the Martin Center for Nashville Ballet.

Mr. Vasterling graduated Magna Cum Laude from Loyola University. He is a Fulbright Scholar and has been awarded many prestigious fellowships and grants, including three from the National Endowment of the Arts. He is also a Virginia Center for the Creative Arts Fellow and was selected as one of the Fellows in residence for the 2017-2018 academic year at The Center for Ballet and the Arts at New York University.

NICK MULLIKIN, CEO and Associate Artistic Director

Nick Mullikin began his training at the Wisconsin Dance Ensemble in Madison, and continued at the Virginia School of the Arts and Houston Ballet Academy. Upon his completion of training with Houston Ballet Academy, he was invited to join Houston Ballet with Artistic Director Ben Stevenson, and subsequently joined Ballet West under the direction of Jonas Kage. During his tenure as a performing artist, Mullikin performed notable works by William Forsythe, George Balanchine, Ben Stevenson, Anthony Tudor, and more. Additionally, he toured nationally and internationally including at the Edinburgh International Festival in 2004 and performed as a guest artist for Ballet Arizona, and regional companies throughout the country.

While at Ballet West, Mullikin was an elected union representative for the American Guild of Musical Artists before joining the administrative staff as the Company/Tour Manager and Assistant to the Artistic Director in 2006. Since that time, he has worked as Company Manager for The Washington Ballet and as Assistant Manager at the Dance Institute in Austin, Texas. Mullikin has guest taught at summer programs and schools across the country, coached students for competition at the Youth America Grand Prix (YAGP), taught in after school programs in the Washington, D.C. area, and consulted on the creation and setup of Honolulu Classical Ballet in Honolulu, Hawaii.

Since joining Nashville Ballet's staff in 2015, Mullikin has made numerous contributions to the organization. Under his direction, School of Nashville Ballet has grown exponentially both in numbers and in strength of training, and NB2, Nashville Ballet's second company, performed its first mainstage production. Promoted to Associate Artistic Director in 2018, Mullikin's advanced role in working with Nashville Ballet's Company has been integral to recent programming choices, defining a more prominent through line from the School of Nashville Ballet Academy to the Company, and much more.


Currently, with his responsibilities at Nashville Ballet, he acts as a YAGP judge, and has coached dancers for YAGP and the International Ballet Competition in Varna, Bulgaria. In 2012, Mullikin graduated from the University of Texas at Austin, majoring in

Government, minoring in Communications, while completing the Business Foundations Program at the McCombs School of Business.

KATIE VASILOPOULOS, Company and Artist Relations Manager

Katie Vasilopoulos developed a love of dance while studying at Maple Avenue Dance in Rockville Centre, NY, then furthered her training at Ballet Academy East in New York City. She joined NB2 in 2008 and progressed to the main company during the 2012 season. She originated several soloist roles in Paul Vasterling's choreography including one of the Three Witches in Macbeth, Tiger Lily in Peter Pan, and the Mother Figure in Appalachian Spring. She was also featured in Jiri Kylian's *Petite Mort,* as the Dark Angel in George Balanchine's Serenade, and in Salvatore Aiello's Afternoon of a Faun. Other highlights include the Swan in Carmina Burana, Snow Queen and the Sugar Plum Fairy in Nashville's Nutcracker, the 4th Movement lead in Balanchine's Western Symphony, Lilac Fairy in *The Sleeping Beauty,* and The Fairy Godmother in Cinderella.

She managed vendors, volunteers, and funders, in a yearlong effort culminating in Ballet Ball 2022 which yielded a record breaking \$486,000. Now as Company and Artist Relations Manager, Ms. Vasilopoulos works closely with artistic leadership, dancers, and visiting artists for artistic collaborations. She manages the contracting, negotiations, and scheduling for operations within the Company.

KATE CREWS LINSLEY, Rehearsal Director

Kate Crews Linsley is a current Rehearsal Director for Nashville Ballet, formerly the School of Nashville Ballet Academy Principal. Linsley enjoyed a successful dance career as a soloist with Ballet West for 10 seasons and danced with Kansas City Ballet from 1995–2000. Most recently, Linsley performed as a guest artist in Salt Lake City with NOW-ID Dance Company and AVA Ballet Theater, where she performed Principal roles in ballets such as Swan Lake, Cinderella, The Sleeping Beauty, and The Nutcracker. Ms. Linsley trained at Kansas City Ballet School under Todd Bolender and The Pacific Northwest Ballet School. Professionally, Linsley's time at Ballet West was highlighted in works in the following world-renowned dance festivals and tours: Edinburg International Dance Festival in Scotland, Dance Across America in Washington, D.C., and Fall

for Dance in New York City. Most memorable roles for Linsley were dancing the Principal Pas de Deux in Balanchine's Agon, Pas de Duex couple in Ulysses Dove's Red Angels, Myrthe in Giselle, The Siren in Balanchine's Prodigal Son, Lilac Fairy in The Sleeping Beauty, Lady Capulet in Kage's Romeo and Juliet, and The Lark in Bruce Mark's Lark Ascending. In February of 2009, cast as the Hostess in Diaghilev's Les Biches, Linsley was honored to be on the cover of Dance Magazine in celebration of Diaghilev's centennial anniversary. From her time with Ballet West and Kansas City Ballet, Linsley's resume contains many works from Tudor, Balanchine, Forsythe, Cranko, Morris, Tharp, and Ashton, to name a few.

After retiring from her professional dance career in June of 2010, Linsley served as the Dance Department Chair at The Waterford School, as well as the Director of the Waterford Dance Academy in Sandy, Utah from 2012 to 2017. During her time there, Linsley restaged the following ballets: The Nutcracker, Alice in Wonderland, Swan Lake, Cinderella, and Carnival of Animals. Linsley was on staff at Ballet West Academy where she taught in the school, as well as coached and created works for dancers for YAGP, Creative Arts Academy Ririe- Woodbury Dance Company, Salt Lake Ballet, AVA Ballet Theater, Utah Regional Ballet, and The University of Utah, among others. Linsley moved to Nashville with her family in 2018 to accept the role of School of Nashville Ballet Academy Principal, where she oversaw the artistic aspects of the School

and trained dancers in the Academy, Professional Training Division, NB2, and Company. During her time with Nashville Ballet, Linsley has staged and coached works for the Academy and NB2 working with Nashville Ballet Artistic Director, Paul Vasterling restaging his work, *Fresco* and with Associate Artistic Director, Nick Mullikin in his creation, *He Loved Big Brother*. Linsley also worked with guest choreographers like Charlotte Boye-Christenson, Michael Bearden, and Gina Patterson in her creation of *72 Steps*. Linsley also staged works on School of Nashville Ballet's Academy, including *Paquita* and *The Sleeping Beauty Suite*. In 2021, Linsley was promoted to Rehearsal Director for Nashville Ballet's main company.

Beyond her career in dance and dance education, Linsley was Chairman of the Board for Inbody Outreach after five years as Executive Director for the Utah nonprofit, which supplies qualified yoga instructors to populations in need. She has served on staff in the Utah yoga community at Centered City Yoga, The Yoga Center, University of Utah, and Primary Children's Medical Center. She is certified to teach yoga to veterans through the Yoga Warriors

Program and at-risk youth under the Street Yoga training. She is also certified in the Mindful Schools curriculum to implement mindfulness teaching in schools. Linsley has led mindfulness sessions on trips traveling with Rivers of Recovery working with Vets with varying degrees of PTSD.

ALLISON ZAMORSKI, Rehearsal Director

Originally from Virginia, Allison Zamorski began her formal dance training with the Virginia Ballet Theatre. She was an honors graduate from the Virginia Governor's School for the Arts High School Dance Program, majoring in both ballet and modern dance. In 1999, after being awarded a scholarship with School of Nashville Ballet, Zamorski relocated to Nashville to train under the direction of Adam Sage. She danced in NB2, Nashville Ballet's second company, developed her skills as an apprentice, and was promoted to full company member in 2002 under Artistic Director Paul Vasterling. Zamorski danced professionally with Nashville Ballet for four years and had multiple ballets set on her including Vasterling's Cinderella, Romeo & Juliet, Giselle, The Sleeping Beauty, and Swan Lake. After retiring as a dancer in 2006, Zamorski continued her expression of dance as a faculty member with School of Nashville Ballet, teaching a variety of dance classes to children and adults including ballet, pointe, modern, character, improvisation, and repertory.

She has worked extensively with the Education and Outreach Department, exposing approximately 30,000 Middle Tennessee residents to the art of dance. Now, as Rehearsal Director with Nashville Ballet, Zamorski stages and rehearses various main company performances and oversees all youth casts in Nashville Ballet productions. Also, Zamorski has the distinct honor of being entrusted to set the works of Paul

Vasterling in Nashville, throughout the country and internationally. Outside of Nashville Ballet, Zamorski has attended the Regional and National High School Dance Festivals to teach master classes and act as adjudicator multiple times.

MING LUKE, Music Director and Principal Conductor

With the "energy, creativity and charisma not seen since Leonard Bernstein" and "vibrant," "mindblowing," and "spectacular" conducting, Ming Luke is a versatile conductor that has excited audiences around the world. Highlights include conducting the Bolshoi Orchestra in Moscow, performances of Romeo and Juliet and Cinderella at the Kennedy Center, his English debut at Sadler's Wells with Birmingham Royal, conducting Dvorak's Requiem in Dvorak Hall in Prague, recording scores for a Coppola film, and over a hundred performances at the San Francisco War Memorial with San Francisco Ballet. He has been recognized nationally for his work with music education and has designed and conducted education concerts and programs with organizations such as the Berkeley Symphony, Houston Symphony, Sacramento Philharmonic, San Francisco Opera and others. Luke has soloed as a pianist with Pittsburgh Symphony, Sacramento Philharmonic, and San Francisco Ballet. Long time critic Allan Ulrich of the San Francisco Chronicle said, "Ming Luke delivered the best live theater performance I've ever heard of [Prokofiev's Romeo and Juliet]" and in 2016 Luke's War Requiem

was named best choral performance of 2016 in the San Francisco Bay Area.

Passionate about collaboration with dance companies and deepening the impact of movement to live music, Luke has guested with Boston Ballet, New York City Ballet Orchestra, Nashville Symphony/Ballet, San Diego Ballet and others and conducted l'Orchestre Prométhée in Paris as part of San Francisco Ballet's residency with Les Etés de la Danse. Noted for is work with Ballet. Famed dancer Natalia Makarova stated, "Ming has a mixture of pure musicality and a sensitivity to needs of the dancers, which are such rare qualities."

Luke has written, arranged, and performed over 150 education concerts with the Berkeley Symphony and has served on grant panels for the National Endowment of the Arts and the Grants and Cultural Committee of the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission. An exciting pops conductor, Luke has created and conducted a variety of pops concerts in many venues, from baseball stadiums, to picnics in the park with over 4,000 people in attendance, traditional concert halls and recording for Major League Baseball.

Ming Luke holds a Master of Fine Arts in Conducting from Carnegie Mellon University and a Bachelor of Music in Music Education and Piano Pedagogy from Westminster Choir College of Rider University.

CAMPBELL BAIRD, Costume and Set Designer

Campbell Baird designed costumes for Nashville Ballet's productions of Nashville's Nutcracker and scenery and costumes for A Midsummer Night's Dream and Peter Pan, all choreographed by Paul Vasterling. He has designed for dance companies around the world, including Oregon Ballet Theatre, Texas Ballet Theatre, and Joffrey Ballet (resident designer for eight years in New York City). He designs for musical theatre, opera, and drama, including recent productions of Happy Birthday for TACT in New York and The Music Man and Crazy For You at Muhlenberg Summer Music Theatre. He was principal design assistant to Oliver Smith, a co-director of American Ballet Theatre for 11 years, supervising productions around the world. For 15 years, he was a scenic artist for the Metropolitan Opera in New York. He is currently an Associate Arts Professor at NYU Tisch School of the Arts, teaching there since 1991. Originally from Wilmington, N.C., he now lives with his partner John McKernon and their Pembroke Welsh corgis in Phillipsburg, N.J. and New York City.

SCOTT LEATHERS, Original Lighting Designer

Scott Leathers served as the Resident Lighting Designer for Nashville Ballet from 1987-2022. He has also served as the Resident Lighting Designer for Nashville Children's Theatre since 2003, Kentucky Repertory Theatre ('04-'08), Chattanooga Symphony





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and Opera and Ballet TN. He periodically serves as interim Lighting Director for the Ryman Auditorium. Mr. Leathers has designed lighting for theatre, opera, ballet and modern dance since 1981 to critical acclaim. His design experience includes work with the Nashville Repertory Theatre, Opera Omaha, Studio West Dance Theatre, Milwaukee Ballet, Theatre Craft, Stage One, American Negro Playwrights Theatre, Amun Ra Theatre, Musical Theatre Louisville, Karen Steele Dance Quintet, Ballet Omaha, Ballet Austin, Cumberland County Playhouse and Dollywood. He has also worked internationally with performing arts organizations such as Tanz Ensemble Cathy Sharp (TECS-Switzerland) and Ballet Manila (Philippines). He has also designed scenery for numerous productions including Nashville Ballet's productions of Robin Hood, Postcards from the Boys, The Bell Witch, Harvest Home, Western Stars, and Fête Champêtre.

JON UPLEGER, Guest Artist

Jon Upleger began his formal training in 1997 under the direction of Petrus Bosman and David Keener at the Virginia School of the Arts. Upon graduation, he received the school's prestigious Dean's Award and then joined Nashville Ballet as an apprentice in 2000. During his time at Nashville Ballet, Mr. Upleger performed roles from such varied repertoire as Romeo in Nashville Ballet Artistic Director Paul Vasterling's *Romeo and Juliet*, the Sugar Plum Cavalier in *Nashville's Nutcracker*, Prince Siegfried

in Swan Lake, and Albrecht in Giselle. Other leading roles include Salvatore Aiello's Satto, Sarah Slipper's Ploughing the Dark, Twyla Tharp's Sinatra Suite, and Paul Vasterling's Awaiting Redemption, Firebird, Cinderella, Carmina Burana, Peter Pan, and The Ben Folds Project: Concerto. In addition to performing with Nashville Ballet's Company, Mr. Upleger has performed with Configurations Dance Theater in New York, Missouri Ballet Theater, and Terpsicorps Theater of Dance in Asheville, N.C. He also taught men's class and pas de deux to students from across the country at School of Nashville Ballet's Summer Intensive. Mr. Upleger helped create Nashville Ballet's Young Men's Scholarship Program, which provides tuition-free ballet training for males age 6-18, and served as a principal instructor. He is now an adjunct professor at Grand Valley State University and recently founded the Grand Rapids School of Dance in west Michigan, which provides ballet-focused training for students ages 2–18 in a nurturing and supportive environment.

SHABAZ UJIMA, Guest Artist

Shabaz Ujima first studied dance at Nashville School of the Arts (1995–1996) and Nashville Ballet (1996–1999). He continued his training at New World School of the Arts (1999–2001) in Miami, Florida and went on to dance in Nashville Ballet's Second Company (2002-2003) before enjoying a successful career in contemporary dance with Cleo Parker Robinson Dance Ensemble (2003–2007) and Dayton

Upon his professional dance retirement in 2014, Mr. Ujima returned to Nashville Ballet. He is currently a full-time faculty member in modern and contemporary dance at School of Nashville Ballet. Mr. Ujima is also a teaching artist for Nashville Ballet's Community Engagement Program, which introduces the art of dance to 40,000 community members each year through visits to schools, libraries, and more. Outside of his work at Nashville Ballet, he teaches mindfulness and yoga to local youth and in the Davidson County Juvenile Detention Center.





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

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
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Nashville Ballet is invested in creating a diverse, equitable, and inclusive community. We believe we can best achieve our mission by creating a climate of respect that is supportive of all voices, celebrating diverse stories, increasing arts access, and sparking communal discussion about our community and our world through our art form and artistic programming. When considering the diversity of the Nashville Ballet community, we look at all aspects, including: race, gender, age, socioeconomic status, disability status, geographic (rural/urban), and sexual orientation. However, Nashville Ballet recognizes the racial inequalities that have plagued the dance world for far too long and is deeply committed to educating our constituencies on systemic racism, engaging in antiracist work in every branch of our organization, and doing our part to abolish racial inequalities in ballet.

Land Acknowledgement

As we share this space today, let us acknowledge the history and wisdom that the ground beneath our feet holds. We recognize that the land that is holding us is the ancestral and traditional Land of the Eastern Cherokee, Chickasaw, and Shawnee peoples, who today have nation boundaries in Oklahoma, after the Indian Removal Act of 1830 led to the forced removal of southern tribes west of the Mississippi River via the Trail of Tears, which weaves throughout this region. We also recognize the Yuchi tribal nation. As residents and culture bearers here now, we are connected to the Indigenous communities of this place through the land. We must honor the people and their history.

The foundation of this land acknowledgment was developed in collaboration with the 2021 Racial Equity in Arts Leadership cohort.



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
